**Seminar Report**

A one day National Seminar on the topic on “Significant Transformation in Higher Education and its Consequences in the context of NEP-2020” *“उच्च शिक्षा में महत्वपूर्ण परिवर्तन एवं NEP-2020 के परिप्रेक्ष्य में इसके परिणाम”* was organized by Govt. Raza P G College, Rampur (UP) on 20 March 2021. **Inaugural session** was started at 10 AM on 20 March 2021, with the ceremonial reception of Guests and dignitaries. After the lightening of Deepak and welcome song by students, The **Convener of Seminar, Dr. P. K. Varshney** Welcome the Chief Guest, Special Guest, Keynote Speaker, learned delegates and other invitees, who had assembled to grace the occasion. The **Organizing Secretary, Dr. Baby Tabassum** introduced the theme and various subthemes of seminar to the audience.

**Briefly Mention about the technological/academic or any other benefit generated by conducting this activity with respect to-**

### **1. The Institution**

National Seminar on important issues interlines the educational institutes. It has become a mandatory exercise for higher educational institutes to organize seminar/conference/symposium etc. NAAC expects the higher educational institutes to organize at least two seminars per year. Most of Indian financing bodies like UGC, CSIR, DST, ICSSR and ICERT etc are generously funding the higher educational institutes for organizing seminar/ conference/ symposium/ workshop etc. Keeping the need of time in view, UP state Govt. has also started to encourage the academic gathering at higher educational institutes, so that exchange of views could take place. It is very difficult for college to invite peers/stakeholders for academic uplift. However, during the seminar/conferences, the academic stalwarts and delegates assemble in the campus to express their opinion. This assembly qualitatively enhances the available human resource within limited financial support.

It has been thirty four years since India made any significant change to its education system. However, finally The National Education Policy (NEP) was unveiled on 31<sup>st</sup> July 2020. The strategy aims to increase public investments in education from 4.4% of India's GDP to 6% and improve education for nearly 300 million students in the country through a host of reforms. To this end the policy sets out comprehensive reforms that will affect every student from the tiny to his first playschool to an ambitious Master's degree considering a Ph. D. Programme. Furthermore, more than 500 brochures of the proposed seminar on such a noble issue were circulated to various higher educational institutes all over India. Hence the college gained wide recognition and publicity in country. Finally, successful completion of seminar in the college helped it to receive the honor regarding its managerial capabilities and academic interest. The seminar also increased the local as well as the national reputation of college.

### **2. The Faculty:**

In the seminar, the faculties not only from Govt. Raza P G College, Rampur but from other neighboring institutes were benefitted from deliberations of seminar. Most of academically sensitive and influential personalities of local area were invited as guest either in inaugural session or valedictory session of seminar.
