Intellectual property (IP) refers to creations of the mind, such as inventions; literary and artistic works; designs; and symbols, names and images used in commerce.

Fair dealing now includes all works, not just literary, dramatic works. With the exception of computer software. So now it sound recordings and video as well.

Fair use includes using a copyrighted work for (1) reporting of affairs, including reporting on a public lecture, (2) criticism or personal use, including research (Section 52 (1a))

The new Section 52(1)(zb) facilitates access to copyrighted works provided that the reproduction of accessible formats is on 'a non-commercial basis', and the organization ensures that the accessible persons with disabilities and takes reasonable steps to prevent the work from being used in ordinary channels of business.

(b) Compulsory license
In cases where the exception to copyright infringement does not benefit persons with disability on a commercial basis may apply compulsory license to publish a work in an accessible format for persons with disabilities.

As per section 52 (n) libraries may legally store and use electronic copies. It is not clear that libraries can lend these electronic copies, because the main purpose of the amendment is to allow libraries to store an electronic copy of their materials for their users. 

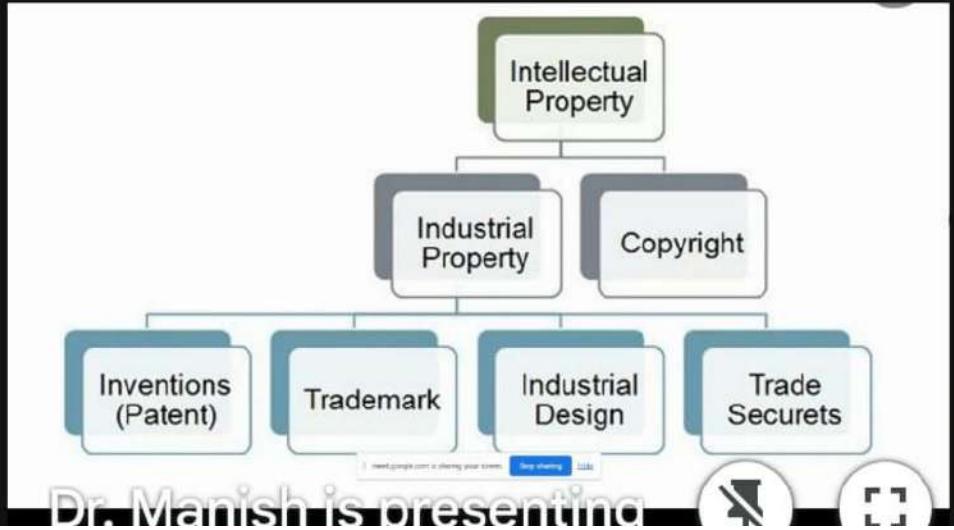
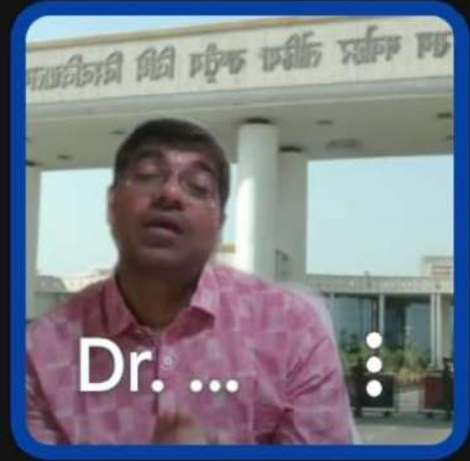
